

### **Article 23 – Trail Easements**

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift, eminent domain, or otherwise, and to accept a deed or deeds of easement interests for the following easements, on such terms and conditions as the Board of Selectmen may determine and in final locations as the Board of Selectmen may determine:

- (1) That certain 10' wide bridle path easement being shown as a “proposed 10' wide bridle path easement” on a plan entitled “Lot Layout Key Plan Bar-K Estates Definitive Subdivision Plan of Land in Dover & Westwood” dated October 22, 1991, recorded with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds as Plan 306 of 1992, and as described more fully in a Bridle Path Easement to the Inhabitants of the Town of Dover recorded with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds at Book 9329 Page 596; and
- (2) That certain bridle path easement, utility easement, and maintenance easement described in a Certificate of Action, Definitive Plan Modification Approved, Wilson’s Way Subdivision, Dover, Massachusetts, dated September 25, 2017 and recorded with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds at Book 35665, Page 202;

or take any other action relative thereto.
